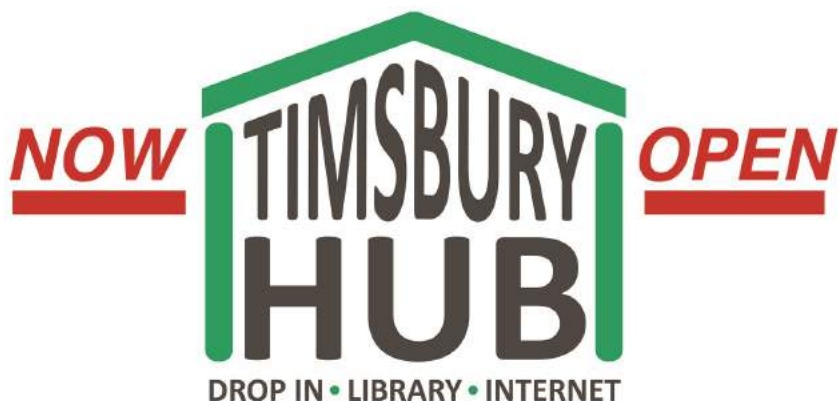

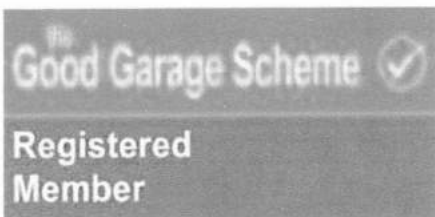

179 Bus Action

Since the 179 bus to Bath was reduced by First Bus 40 residents came to a Parish Council meeting telling us how this reduced service is wholly inadequate and will affect many people's lives.

The Parish Council wrote articles in local papers and complained to B&NES. We will be working with nearby Parish Councils to try to set up a community bus service by next August.

War Memorial Improvement

The Memorial in Newmans Lane is being enlarged with new stone work and motifs as part of the Centenary of the end of World War 1.

The Parish Council is funding this with a generous local resident. Unfortunately the contractor was not able to complete this before the Armistice Day - see pages 4 and 5.



Bath Clean Air Zone

The Parish Council has objected to B&NES council about this proposal stating that it discriminates against rural and other areas where drivers do not have adequate alternative bus services to travel other than by car; it does not take account of the imminent closure of some rural bus services; the charges are a blunt instrument which will not reduce air pollution because poorer drivers cannot upgrade their old

vehicles because they do not have the money; and the high charges will lock such rural residents out of Bath. Also, we expect terrible traffic and jams on routes nearby to avoid Bath. What is needed is a properly-funded and managed integrated transport system for which the West of England Combined Authority is now responsible for.

New Local Plan by B&NES

B&NES council is revising its Local Plan for new housing and economic development.

In its consultation there are three proposed Options for policies for sites to build a further 700 homes in rural areas, in addition to the 50 already allocated to Timsbury; Focused Option with 200 houses targeted at Timsbury; Dispersed Option with 100 for Timsbury; and a Fully Dispersed option with no numbers for Timsbury.

The Parish Council responded by stating it's preference for the third 'Dispersed' Option because it had carried out detailed assessments for two sites in the village already showing that they are not appropriate for development due to landscape and access issues, and nor are they deliverable. Also, it pointed out that the village is losing bus services and that North Road is already busy.

Parish Council Elections

Next May, any local resident can stand to become a Parish Councillor to make decisions and create initiatives about many things for the village. It is a

chance to get involved and make a real difference. No special experience is needed, just enthusiasm. See page 21.

Timsbury Centenary Remembrance Service

On Sunday, 11th November, we held our Centenary Remembrance Service at the Memorial next to the Royal British Legion Club, followed by a service in St Mary's Church both conducted by the Rev Martin Blewett.

We had a very large crowd attend both services and at the memorial the names of all those who lost their lives from Timsbury in the First and Second World War were read out, followed by the "Exhortation" by Barry Sewell, Chairman of the Royal British Legion Branch.

The Last Post was sounded by Ben Haslam and Chris Fiddes, Standard Bearer preformed the "Act of Homage". Wreaths were then laid by representatives from the Armed Forces, Royal British Legion, Parish Council, The Lions, Girl Guides and Brownies.

This year I also asked children from Year 6, St Mary's Primary School, to hand write a message of Remembrance to go on the wreaths for each of the 17 men from Timsbury who lost their lives in the First World War.



The wreaths were specially designed by the Royal British Legion to mark the Centenary with the words 'Thank You' to all who served, sacrificed and changed our world 1918-2018. At the memorial they marched up proudly and laid their wreaths in Remembrance.



The service at St Mary's Church had some very poignant moments for everyone, including reading out the names of those who died in WW1 by the Brownies while candles were lit for each one and a further 12 candles for those in the Second World War.

Readings remembering two of the youngest men who died from Timsbury (Private George Trim & Private John James) were read by Tom and Leo Blewett and a poem, 'Why Wear A Poppy' read by Barry Sewell Chairman of Timsbury 'Royal British Legion'. These were all very moving and a fitting tribute to the fallen on the 100th

Anniversary of the end the First World War.

On behalf of the Royal British Legion, I would like to thank all those who attended and participated on the day and also for your very generous service collection of **£260** which will go towards this years Poppy Appeal collection.

This year's Poppy Appeal total is not yet available, but the final figure will be published in your next newsletter.

Those of us who have reached the middle part of life and beyond can probably recall several dozen Christmases, and will have quite a store of memories to fall back on...Was it a bicycle as a child? A piece of jewellery? A particularly jaw-dropping sweater from a Great Aunt? A small misshapen pot from the pottery class at school? A bag of sweets saved carefully with November's pocket money?

We will all have our own particular memories of cherished gifts from Christmases past. I knew I had reached my Coming of Age Christmas when I received three separate gifts of Old Spice after-shave (Yes; it was 1973).

The giving of gifts is known and valued in every society, every culture and era. It is a natural and spontaneous part of human nature to give to express affection, respect, regard or thanks through the giving of gifts. 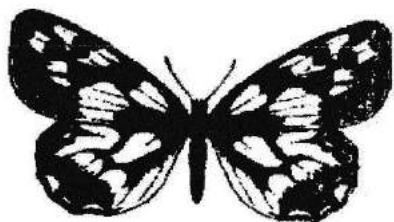
We raised £380 for Children's Hospice South West. We also received £50 from Timsbury's allotment holders, which they raised at the flower show at Taste of Timsbury.

Christmas Presents Galore!

There's nothing they need, don't own already, or even want. So you buy them a solar-powered waving queen; a belly button brush; a "hilarious" inflatable zimmer frame; or confection of plastic and electronics called Terry the Swearing Turtle.

They seem amusing on the first day of Christmas, daft on the second, embarrassing on the third. By the twelfth they're in landfill. Purchases which give thirty seconds of dubious entertainment will ramify for generations.

Only 1% of materials flowing through the consumer economy remain in use six months after sale. And much of what we buy never even had a 'use'. A Darth Vader talking piggy bank; an individual beer can chiller; a sonic screwdriver remote control; bacon toothpaste: they are designed to elicit thanks, perhaps a snigger or two, and then be thrown away.

The fatuity of the products is matched by the profundity of the impacts. Rare materials, complex electronics, the energy needed for manufacture and transport, are extracted and refined and combined into compounds of utter pointlessness. Manufacturing and consumption are responsible for more than half of our carbon dioxide production. We are screwing the planet

to make desktop crazy golfers.

People in eastern Congo are massacred to facilitate smart phone upgrades of ever diminishing marginal utility.

Forests are felled to make "personalised heart-shaped wooden cheese board sets". Rivers are poisoned to manufacture talking fish.

Consumption

This is pathological consumption: a world-consuming epidemic of collective madness, rendered so normal by advertising and the media that we scarcely notice what has happened to us. Pathological consumption has become so normalised that we barely notice it.

Bake me a cake

The best presents don't perpetuate this madness. Bake them a cake, write them a poem, give them a kiss, tell them a joke, but for god's sake stop trashing the planet to tell someone you care. All it shows is that you don't.

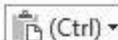

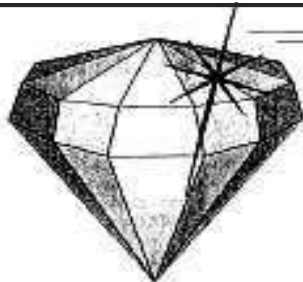
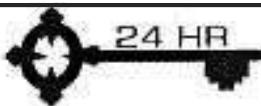
