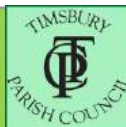

# Anniversary of The Hub Library

Before Christmas, Timsbury celebrated the first anniversary of the Library Hub with a visit from local author, Katherine Webb, tea and cakes and a children's treasure hunt.

Set up by Timsbury Parish Council, the library has attracted 130 new members and 3,000 books have been loaned during the year. It is part of the full B&NES Council library system with 3,000 books in stock and access to two million books that can be ordered from Libraries West.

Josie Pownall, the Chairman of the Parish Council commented: "The Timsbury Hub has been a great new service for the village. Residents can

borrow books, read a selection of daily newspapers and have a go at the community jigsaw. They can pick up all manner information about the surrounding area and events that residents may be interested in – meetings, clubs, talks and of all sorts of activities for all sorts of people of all sorts of ages.

"Teas/coffees and comfy chairs are also available for those who wish to drop in, drop out and stay a while and there is a fun area for children. There are plans to develop the services available in the future and for the library to become a real 'go to' Hub for the village. Hub co-ordinator Liz Casson and the volunteers

are to be congratulated for making such a great success of the project in its first year.”

The Hub, in the YMCA building beside the Co-op, is open afternoons on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday and on Saturday mornings. Organised sessions

include Gadget Busters, Parent and Baby Group, Cabinet of Curiosities reminiscences and a Carers Wellness Cafe. A computer with internet access is available to use for 30-minute sessions. Photocopying and printing services are available at a small charge.

# Minister's Letter

Well, that's 2019 done! Welcome 2020. Even the most reclusive of persons could not but be aware that the last twelve months have been a tumultuous time in our national life. Parliamentary life has been a 'White-Knuckle Ride' with climatic votes every other day; the departure of Prime Ministers and Party leaders; a General Election and new Prime Minister and government ready to take the helm as we steer into 2020.

Whether we welcome the present political accommodation or not, it seems likely that the coming year looks a little less exciting than the last.

We stand at the beginning of a new month, a new year and a new decade. The 2020's. It is difficult to believe the 1920's are now a century away. # **Carers' Centre teams up the Bath Mind for Support Café at Timsbury Hub**

Loneliness and isolation is a major issue faced by many carers. Looking after someone can be emotionally and physically draining and many carers feel unable to ask for help, which is why the B&NES Carers' Centre has teamed up with the Bath Mind to support carers in the Timsbury area.

Since October, the two charities have been running a Support Café, which takes place the third Tuesday of each month at the Timsbury Hub in North Road from 2.00pm-4.00pm.

The Hub offers a relaxed and safe meeting space where carers can get advice and information while socialising over a cuppa.

On hand will be staff from the Carers' Centre, who can help with practical and emotional support as well as provide information on a wide range of free services it offers.

Members of Bath Mind will also be there offering support and advice to carers or anyone who wants to check in on their wellbeing and mental health.

One attendee at the café said: "I am involved with mental health groups and the Timsbury group was my first visit. It

was warm and non-judgemental, it helped me. I would go again."

Another café user said: "I am a service user of Mind but my partner has health problems so it has been doubly useful talking to the Carers' Centre staff about what is available by way of support."

# Youth Work in Timsbury

Friday Night Youth Club for those in School Years 7-9 is continuing to run Friday evenings at the YMCA 7.15pm-8.30pm, £1 (includes drink and a snack), new members welcome. This is a relaxed club with pool, table tennis, hockey, X-Box, craft, simple cooking and a chance to meet and socialise. In school holidays we usually enjoy a trip: the most recent one being swimming.

In the run up to Christmas we did some fantastic pottery sessions with [firetcreate.co.uk](http://firetcreate.co.uk).



Our dedicated team of volunteers has been joined by some amazing parent helpers who have provided lots of added value.

The Cookery Project, a small group of 12-15 year olds who plan, cook and eat together has restarted on a Wednesday evening at the YMCA. The last group marked the end of their project by planning and preparing a meal for their families. This involved cooking for seventeen people.

The cost of the Cookery group is £1.50 per week, which covers ingredients. The project lasts roughly eight weeks to give different people a chance to join. Do let me know if you would like to come along when there is availability.

I would encourage parents and interested adults to get involved with the Parish Council's Consultation event on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> February (details on page 15 ) to consider how your money can be spent most effectively for the benefit of local young people. By the time you read this, the first consultation with 11-18 year olds will have already taken place.

On a more reflective note, I have recently been reading a book on Youth Work. One of the headings was "Where have all the grown ups gone?" The premise was that young people today

are growing up with fewer meaningful interactions with adults in their lives and the detrimental effect which this is having on community, social cohesion and for the young people trying to find their way in life. If this is something which concerns you, or indeed if you disagree, and you would like to get in

touch, then I'm always open to meeting for a coffee & chat!

# Recycle: reuse, repair, refill

## Timsbury Green Action Group

You may be surprised to hear that latest figures for recycling rates in the UK show that they actually dropped between 2017 and 2018. Currently, the UK is set to miss the EU target of 50% of household waste being recycled or reused by 2020. Our local Council, Bath and North East Somerset has been encouraging us to improve rates of recycling and we can all do more to recycle as much as possible as part of reducing our carbon emissions. We can save one tonne of carbon dioxide a year per household, if we recycle 50% of our household waste.

Timsbury Parish Council would like to help our residents to understand the options available to support reducing our carbon emissions. This is the first of a series of articles to provide ideas and information.

Recycling is not our only option. There are now more opportunities to reuse and repair such as using the Share and Repair Cafes. For more information on local cafes, see [shareandrepair.org.uk/repair-cafes](http://shareandrepair.org.uk/repair-cafes). Does anyone want to set one up in Timsbury?

Recycling broken and unwanted electrical goods which have a plug or use batteries, is now possible through the green box collections. For example, you can put items such as electric

toothbrushes, hi-fi equipment and phones in your box. For more on this see [bathnes.gov.uk/campaigns](http://bathnes.gov.uk/campaigns).

To avoid non-recyclable packaging, look for where you can refill containers and look out for items in eco-friendly packaging. Our Health & More shop in the High Street is a trail blazer in this and selling eco-products where possible. They aim to stock cards with no plastic wrapping and source their candles from suppliers who do not use palm oil. In order to reduce single-use plastic, they also provide refillable solutions for milk, eggs, olive oil, wine, and detergent products.

### **Kick-starting an environmental movement for change.**

A local woman from Farmborough, Charlotte Dagless, is organising an event on **Saturday, March 7<sup>th</sup> from 3.00pm to 5.00pm in Farmborough Village Hall**. This is a free event aiming to help people learn about how they can respond to environmental challenges at a local level. More details in the next Timsbury Letter.

# Death of Jer Thompson

Mendip Crematorium was packed to overflowing for the funeral of a much-respected local sportsman, Jer Thompson, who has died after a long illness.

The talented cricketer who played for a number of local clubs and who played minor counties cricket for Wiltshire, has spent the last 20 years at Timsbury. Here he inspired a generation of players both as a colleague and latterly as a coach, with the determination and drive that was the hallmark of his character.

Jer was brought up in Writhlington attending St Mary's Primary School and the local Comprehensive. He represented Avon Schools and Somerset at youth level and also played

for a number of local football teams.

He played cricket for Temple Cloud before moving to Bath where he was coached by former Somerset batsman and county umpire Peter Wight. He played for Somerset second eleven and played for Wiltshire against Warwickshire in the Gillette Cup where he faced South African quickie Alan Donald.

He was later to play for Midsomer Norton and Keynsham in the Western League before being persuaded to join Timsbury by Darren Wilkins. He was one of the historic eleven which reached the National Village Final at Lords in 2006.

In a tribute to Jerry all of his team mates came to the funeral dressed in

the outfits worn at the final. Wilkins, who has remained a close friend, led the tributes with an emotional eulogy.

After leaving school Jer went into the building industry before joining Ford Fuel Oils. He married his wife Anne-Marie in 1990 and they have one son Sol who plays cricket for Timsbury and rugby for Chew Valley. Anne-Marie said that it was clear from the many cards and messages that they have received that Jer had a big influence on people's lives.

She said, "Jer expected everyone to give maximum effort and had a great work ethic. As an individual he was very humble and never wanted any fuss. He was a devoted family man and his death will leave a big hole in our lives."

Jer, who is also survived by father Ken and sister Bridget, showed the same determination in fighting the illness that made life so difficult for him over the last 12 months before losing the battle and passing away at the age of 56.

## **Boccia Has Arrived at The Conygre Hall**

A permanent boccia court has now been installed at the Conygre Hall in the main hall. This is a first for Timsbury and almost unique in the South West of England. The court is about the same size as the existing badminton court, without the net.

The rules for the game of Boccia are similar to the rules of Bowls, Boules or Petanque. The idea is to get your ball closer to the jack ball than the opponent's ball. There are 6 blue balls, 6 red balls and a white jack ball. The game can be played by two teams of three players with two balls each, two pairs with three balls each or two individuals with six balls each.

Each player must be seated and remain seated within the perimeter lines of

their own throwing box when they throw the ball.

A match is made up of ends depending on the format. Teams play six ends so each player throws the jack once. Pairs and individuals play four ends. If the final score is a draw, then an individual tie break end is played to determine the winner.

If you would like to find out more about this game there will be introduction sessions at Farmborough Memorial Hall from 10.00am to 12 noon on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday of every month. The next session is 20<sup>th</sup> February.

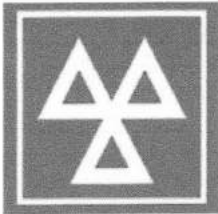

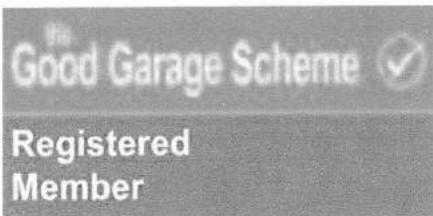

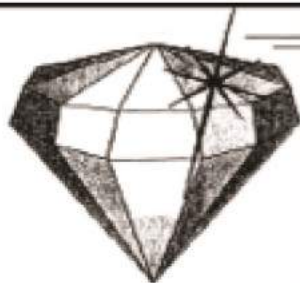
