RETIREMENT OF THE PARISH CLERK

Angela Wilson has retired as parish clerk after five years in the role. Marking her departure Timsbury Parish Council chairman KC Bradley thanked her for all her commitment and hard work on behalf of everyone who lives in the village.

“Work as a public servant is rarely easy and comes with challenges that are seldom appreciated by most of those who benefit from that effort” he said. “Angela has tackled those challenges and has been a very efficient and effective clerk. The experience and knowledge that Angela brought to her work here was a great help to me and indirectly has also been a real advantage to all of us.”

“Parish councils are an essential part of local government”. Mr Bradley continued. “The clerk ensures the councillors act lawfully and comply with all relevant legislation, manages meetings and carries out decisions. The clerk is also the responsible financial officer preparing budgets and monitoring spending. For Timsbury the annual budget is approaching £120,000 a year and includes the hub library, youth and children support, play and recreation areas and public lighting.”

“Angela has coped with all of this and dealt sensitively with the aggravations and hassle of local politics. On behalf of the village I can assure her that she leaves with our deepest gratitude and all our best wishes for an enjoyable retirement”.

In response Angela declared that she had enjoyed every minute of her time in Timsbury. “I liked the job so much because no two days are the same and

this makes it so interesting and challenging. The councillors have been very supportive and there is a real community life in the village. The population has grown over the years but there are families that have lived here for generations which contributes to the friendly spirit that I found so welcoming. “Now I shall have a break and maybe organise some travel around England but I shall be very happy to consider this my second home,” she said.

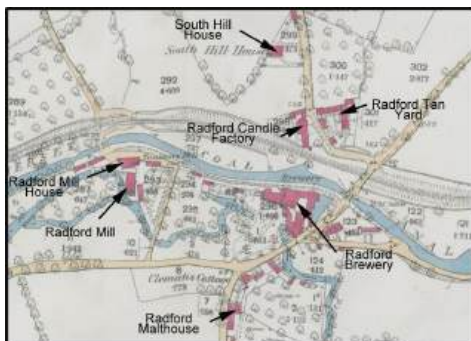
ASPECTS OF THE HISTORY OF SOME HERITAGE BUILDINGS IN TIMSBURY

Radford Villa



Radford Villa was once part of the complex of industrial activity that developed around Radford Mill. The current mill dates from the 18th century, but it is most likely that the mill recorded at Timsbury in the Domesday Book would have been here. Radford Mill is inextricably linked with the Collins family. Records show them operating the mill from at least 1611. James Collins, who was a tenant in 1781, purchased the mill, mill house and twenty acres of land from James Stephens of Camerton Court for £1900 in 1788. The family then developed a brewery, a tanning factory and a candle factory aided by proximity to the Somersetshire Coal Canal and then the railway.



James and Sarah Collins had eight children, six boys and two girls. James died in 1792 and Sarah in 1827. The 1838 Tithe Map shows several industrial activities run by different sons: Radford Mill (William Collins – third son), a Brewery (John Collins – fourth son), a Tan Yard (George Collins – fifth son) and a Candle Factory (Jacob Collins – sixth son). George Collins became so affluent he built South Hill House in approximately 1832.

Radford Villa, originally called Mill Mead House, was built about 1805 as part of a brewery by John. The Regency extension was added during the 1830s.



The brewery was eventually taken over by relatives of the Collins family – the

Rossiters – and Radford Villa was converted into a market garden in 1907 and continued until the 1940s. They specialised in carnations, which were packaged and sent to Bath and London. The association with the Collins and Rossiter families continued well into the

20th century, though after Radford and Timsbury Halt railway station closed in 1925 the different industrial activities became less profitable and closed.

TIMSBURY NATURAL HISTORY

On Monday 21st September Timsbury Nats start a new season of talks. In the Jeff Sluggett Room, Conygre Hall the group will be hosting Andy Daw who will be giving a talk on the Butterflies and Woodpeckers of Hungary. The meeting starts at 7.30pm. Entry is £5 though it is free for under 18s. Under 16s to be accompanied by an adult.

When it comes to butterflies Hungary has around three times the number of species that can be found in Britain. These butterflies benefit from the countries fauna. Most notably in the national parks where butterflies are protected. The most common butterflies are the Hungarian Glider and the Hungarian Skipper also known as the Orbed Red-underwing Skipper.

With Hungarian Woodpeckers they outnumber Britain's three species of Woodpecker by three. These nine species are thrive in its diverse oak, beech, and floodplain forests, as well as rural orchards and city parks.

On the following Saturday (26th) the group will be visiting the Avon Wildlife Trust nature reserve Folly Farm. The reserve is a designated Site of Scientific Interest (SSSI) which protects rich wildflower meadows, old woods and a 400 year old 'Folly Oak'. NB dogs are strictly prohibited on the reserve. The meeting is at 10.30am.

Timsbury Nats will be celebrating their golden anniversary in October. Sadly we will be without the delightful Chris Bateman. Chris, a stalwart of the group will be greatly missed.

TIMSBURY NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN WORK

In the last letter I raised that progress was good and we were actively working on the evidence based for the Natural Environment, Built Environment a proposed Timsbury Design Code and a Community Survey. I can update you on work done so far and introduce more detail on the survey plus an update on our logo.

The teams for Natural and Built Environment are working steadily including a piece to show how Timsbury village has expanded over the last 70 years and what elements of the local environment have been lost to development and potentially the impact of future possible developments. Again an article from Larry Cunningham in the August edition this time about Vale House is very good evidence of the built environment of our village. Thank you Larry.



A large piece of work has been completed for a proposed Timsbury Design Guide that details what we would expect to see from future developments and what should be incorporated by the architects and planners when they submit proposals. This document is now up to version 7 and in a draft form will go to BANES Planners soon. Within it there are pictures of houses, buildings and features

around the village to explain what we would like to see. Photos have been taken from a public viewpoint or from existing publicly distributed open sources and do not include any personal detail. When we come to display the work you will be able to see if your property is shown as examples of what we wish to see in the future.

The logo to cover the Neighbourhood Plan has been reviewed and redesigned following feedback and Jacqui Grainger has developed some wonderful new versions that as a group we are agreeing on but will confirm at our next meeting in late August and then we will be able to show them to you in September and in the October issue of this letter.

Finally, there will be a Community Survey issued in September and although the Parish Council kindly agreed to its distribution within the September issue of the Timsbury Letter, the survey will need separate distribution and collection. The survey will be available in paper copy, and electronic format and also via a QR code. The Sites for collection have been agreed and we ask that as many people as possible compete the survey so we do gather views from across the village population, young and older, new arrivals as well as long standing residents. We are also targeting groups that meet locally. The survey will be distributed street by street, road by road so not everyone will receive it on the same day.

So, there is progress going on and in September you will be asked to contribute to mould the future growth of the village.

MEMORIES OF CHRIS SELWYN 1957-2026

Haycombe Valley Chapel was full on 30th July for the funeral of Chris Selwyn who sadly died at his home at the Hook after a short illness. Chris lived all his life in Somerset. He met his wife Brenda at Bath University and they married in 1987. Having moved to Timsbury in 1996 with their young son Laurence their time was initially taken up with work and family.

Chris worked in IT until he retired in 2017 and was then able to become much more involved in village life and to pursue his many interests. I first met Chris as part of the Timsbury Pétanque League where he and his team, the Wild Things, were very successful. However, there was a slightly quirky side to Chris and his fellow team members. Most teams had a captain and a vice-captain - the Wild Things insisted that they were an anarcho-syndicalist collective! The recording of results in the early years was on pieces of paper held behind the bar of the Seven Stars and the creation of the fixture schedule was very haphazard. However, Chris stepped in to improve on this method, and this was the first example for me where he used his IT

skills for the benefit of others. He created a website from scratch and incorporated software that created fixtures automatically resulting in the administration of the league becoming so much smoother.

Chris was a keen walker and his daily routine involved an afternoon walk. Following his retirement, he completed 19,613 miles - a wonderful achievement. He recorded all his walks as he went along so if you asked where he was walking on any particular date he could answer very accurately! He enjoyed immensely walking in the countryside around Timsbury and was very appreciative of the benefits.

Another aspect he really took great pleasure from was meeting people on these walks. I know some who had regular chats with him, but I suspect there must be so many more who enjoyed his company and will miss him very much. He so loved walking that he created a series of virtual walks of all the public footpaths in the parish. He also produced a panoramic virtual tour of historic Timsbury. Both can be seen in the Walks section of the Timsbury Community website and are well worth visiting.

Over many years he supported the Parish Council helping to maintain and troubleshoot (sometimes quite frequent) issues on the Timsbury Community Website. His work was very much appreciated.

I know Chris loved researching his family's history and he could tell you about all those of his ancestors who had been vicars or rectors and many were connected to local churches. Often when walking with him, we'd approach a church and he was able to recite straight away his family connection. One day I thought I would try to catch him out by telling him that on a particular walk we would be visiting St Mary's in Charlcombe and that there was a connection to him.

Beforehand he was very frustrated that he couldn't find that connection. I thought I'd succeeded in my quest, but when we entered the church he immediately went to look at the pews which had been made by master carpenter Robert Mouseman Thompson. Before I could say anything, he'd found the connection as he and Brenda have some of Thompson's furniture. This was a great illustration of his enquiring mind and powers of observation. He will be much missed.

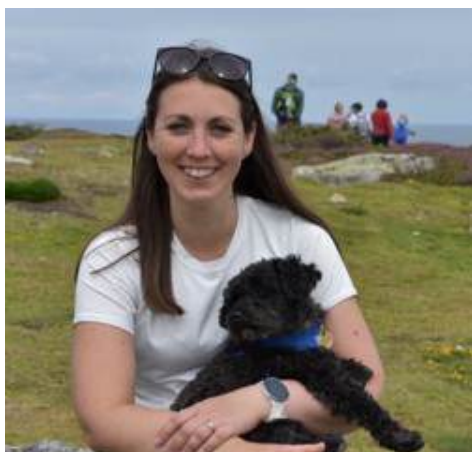
AN INTRODUCTION TO TIMSBURY'S WILDLIFE CHAMPIONS

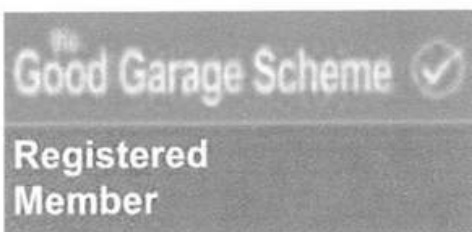
